CHARLIE CONKLIN UPDATE

Excerpt from a letter to Ed Rocco

ED, I am doing fine. Yes, I have joined the Springfield-Franconia Host Lions Club, which is structured somewhat different. The Host Club, formed an offshoot club quite a few year ago. It operates totally independent of "Our" Club. I know that they meet at lunch time (their primary meeting) and they sell fruit (oranges & ?) at Christmas time as their primary fund raiser. I know very little else about their activities. "Our" Club has somewhere about 20 active members, 2 privileged members and 4 members-at-large. The prime yearlong activity is a "flea market". Most everyone helps to run it and that takes virtually all manpower. It yields about \$2,000/ time and generates roughly \$30,000/year. This is what the Club runs on. It takes 4 members per time to run the market which operates on Saturdays from April to mid-November. It can get "rained out" and sometimes we "hire" some friends to assist. This is so our members don't get "burned-out". The only other activity that the membership participates in is working at the Eveglass Recycling Center of NOVA. One of our members works there and groups go over and volunteer occasionally. We sponsor a Leo Club at Hayfield Secondary School and members assist there and in doing eye exams at several grade Schools in the local district. I don't think they do anything "better" maybe different (?). If you want to run a "flea market" (which could make a lot of money) you need "man-power" a place to run it such as a Park (with space), toilet facilities, and it is good to have eating facilities near-by such as Burger King. Give my best to everyone, I miss being there. Charles Conklin. P.S. Dues are \$100/year (\$25/quarter) which covers national and district dues.
